Any cast members who have unexcused absences this week risk being removed from the show. Additionally, it has been our policy to expect students who are ill to attend rehearsal if they have been in school all day. If you are well enough to make it through the school day, we expect to see you in rehearsal as well. Our attendance policies regarding the final two weeks of the show are nothing new and we are very proactive in spelling out our expectations in all audition materials. Please do what you must to ensure your attendance. Okay, enough with the threats and coercion!

I LOVE this stage of the process, but it only works if cast members consciously take the feedback we offer in order to grow and improve. **Please show us you care about the quality of the show by reviewing rehearsal notes. We have now made them available online.** Just visit our production's webpage (http://wbhstheatre.com/current_season/FOTR_prod_pg.htm) and look under the "Rehearsal Notes" section. Review the notes at home, and make the adjustments they request in rehearsal this next week. We'll be keeping tabs on adjustments, so show us you care! Chorus members, there are many notes for you as well. The best way to review the notes is to do a search for your name, your character's name, and "Full Cast" or "Large Group" notes. You can search for specific text in documents, PDF's, and even on websites by simply hit "Ctrl F" and typing in the word(s) you're searching for. If this feature is news to you, you're welcome! It's a very useful function!

A quick word about costumes. Please make sure you speak with Mrs. Kadian on Thurs, April 21st if you have any questions or concerns about your costume. Additionally, please make sure you bring in any additional costume items (shoes, dress shirts, etc.) that you have been asked to bring in no later than Saturday. Beards, beards, beards! Makeup department members, I'm hoping our material for beards comes in this week. If so, I would love to start playing with them THIS WEEK. Additionally, personal makeup kits have arrived. However, we will not be distributing them until Saturday morning.

Okay, last but not least. **TICKETS ARE GOING FAST!** I am really excited to announce that our ticket sales have been truly robust. Additionally, a general press release about the show and ticket sales will be sent out by our school district this week. An online article will also run in the West Bloomfield Beacon this week.
