Please remember to **BRING IN A SNACK TO EAT FOR AFTER SCHOOL ON WEDNESDAY**. We DO NOT have a dinner break that day so that we can get out of rehearsal earlier that night. It will be a long stretch, so please have something to eat before we begin our work on that day. In addition, please be diligent in getting downstairs to change, being in place for mic checks, and returning on-time from dinner breaks. Our schedule is extremely tight as is this week. We cannot afford to lose time waiting for cast members who are lax in getting ready. Please remember to also bring in all necessary, remaining costume items on Monday. And, gentlemen, **NO WHITE SOCKS ONSTAGE!** Also, please remember that strike will take place on Mon, May 2nd from 2:30-5pm. All *high school* cast members are required to participate in strike. Failure to attend strike may affect your ability to participate in future productions.

I would like to take a minute to thank all of the adult staff members and parent volunteers who have worked so very hard on this production. I am extremely indebted to each of you. Show after show, our adult staff members and parent volunteers sacrifice vast portions of their personal time for your benefit. I would ask that each of our cast members show them how much you appreciate all that they do for you. Please thank them when you see them this week! I would also like to thank and ask that you also show your gratitude for the countless hours and vast amount of work that our student production staff has done on your behalf. Our student directors and student producer have been working on this show since January. They arrive at rehearsal before you are present, they stay past the time when you leave, and they do not receive direct recognition of their efforts from audiences. Please show them how much you appreciate the vast amount of work they have done on your behalf.

In just one week, this entire process will be a part of our collective past experiences. Each show provides me with an amazingly unique and priceless set of memories. I've had a wonderful time getting to know our program's newest members. I've also enjoyed spending the past several weeks with our seniors who will soon be on their way to the next chapter of their lives. Seniors, there will be a few more department functions, social gatherings, and opportunities for the group to interact, but this weekend's performances signal the end of our formal time together. Thank you for spending the past four years in theatre. I've enjoyed every minute we've had together. Well, okay, not *every single minute* but most of them anyway!
